Independent Accountant's Report

Citizens of the State of Nebraska:

We have reviewed the expenditures, fixed assets, grants, payroll, and revenues of the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board for the period April 1, 2008, through March 31, 2009. The Nebraska Environmental Trust Board's management is responsible for the expenditures, fixed assets, grants, payroll, and revenues. Management did not provide us a written assertion regarding such matters.

Our review was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the standards applicable to attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. A review is substantially less in scope than an examination, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion on the expenditures, fixed assets, grants, payroll, and revenues. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

Based on our review, nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that the expenditures, fixed assets, grants, payroll, and revenues are not presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the criteria set forth in the Criteria section.

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we are required to report findings of deficiencies in internal control, violations of provisions of contracts or grant agreements, and abuse that are material to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board's expenditures, fixed assets, grants, payroll, and revenues and any fraud and illegal acts that are more than inconsequential that come to our attention during our review. We are also required to obtain the views of management on those matters. We did not perform our review for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the internal control over the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board's expenditures, fixed assets, grants, grants, payroll, and revenues or on compliance and other matters; accordingly, we express no such opinions.

Our review disclosed no findings that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Citizens of the State of Nebraska, management of the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board, others within the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board, and the appropriate Federal and regulatory agencies; however, this report is a matter of public record, and its distribution is not limited.

Background

In 1992, the Legislature established the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board "for the purpose of conserving, enhancing, and restoring the natural, physical and biological environment of the State."

The Nebraska Environmental Trust Board administers funds to support short and long-term environmental goals and attempts to provide funding for proposals relating to habitat, surface and ground water, waste management, air quality, and soil management. Anyone, including citizens, organizations, communities, farmers, and businesses, can apply for funding. The three types of grants available are General Grants (for grants more than \$15,000), Recognition Grants (for grants \$15,000 and less), and Public Information and Education Grants (for grants \$2,500 and less).


The Nebraska Lottery (Lottery) transfers monies to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board based on Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812 (Reissue 2007) which requires a portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets, which have been sold on an annualized basis, to be transferred to the beneficiary funds, except that the dollar amount transferred shall not be less than the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2003. Forty-four and one-half percent of lottery proceeds are put into the Environmental Trust Fund after prizes and operating expenses are paid for and the first \$500,000 of proceeds are paid to the Compulsive Gamblers' Assistance Fund.

The Nebraska Environmental Trust Board, which manages the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, consists of 14 members, 9 of which are appointed by the Governor for six-year terms. These 9 members of the public are chosen based upon demonstrated competence, experience, and interest in the State's environment, and at least two are required to have experience in private financing of public purpose projects. Three appointees are chosen from each congressional district. Other Board membership consists of the directors of the Nebraska Departments of Agriculture, Environmental Quality, Natural Resources, Health and Human Services, and the Game and Parks Commission.

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-15,174.01 (Reissue 2008) established the Nebraska Environmental Endowment Fund to carry out the purposes of the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act.


For administrative purposes only, the Board is a part of the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission.


Expenditures of the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board for the period April 1, 2008, through March 31, 2009, consisted of grants, payroll, operating expenses, and travel. For these areas, the total amounts for the period are noted in the chart below. The Nebraska Environmental Trust Board's total expenditures for the period were \$12,454,378.



Revenues of the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board for the period April 1, 2008, through March 31, 2009, consisted of Lottery transfers, investment activities, Ferguson House rental, and other miscellaneous income. For these areas, the total amounts for the period are noted in the chart below. The Nebraska Environmental Trust Board's total revenues for the period were \$14,524,478.

Criteria

The criteria used in this attestation review were Nebraska State Statutes, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Board's Administrative Regulations, and the Administrative Services State Accounting Manual.

Summary of Procedures

Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 84-304 (Reissue 2008), the Auditor of Public Accounts (APA) conducted an attestation review of the expenditures, fixed assets, grants, payroll, and revenues for the period April 1, 2008, through March 31, 2009, in accordance with standards applicable to

attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. The APA's attestation review consisted of the following procedures:

The APA performed a number of procedures common to the subject matter identified. These procedures included gaining an understanding of internal control, analytical procedures, and follow-up of prior year recommendations. Procedures performed unique to a certain subject matter are identified below.

Expenditures

- 1. Reviewed and tested various expenditure transactions, including journal entries.
- 2. Reviewed contract procedures.
- 3. Reviewed vendor selection process.

Fixed Assets

1. Traced fixed assets from the asset listing to the floor and from the floor to the asset listing.

Grants

- 1. Reviewed and tested grants expenditures, grants process, and grants monitoring.
- 2. Reviewed and tested follow-up procedures for equipment, buildings, and land purchased by grantees with Trust funds.

Payroll

- 1. Tested employee compensation including calculation of the adjusted service date, leave earnings, usage, and balances.
- 2. Reviewed Board Member attendance at meetings and payment of related expenses.

Revenues

- 1. Verified cash fund restrictions or specific purposes were adhered to.
- 2. Reviewed and tested transfers from the Nebraska Lottery.
- 3. Reviewed lease agreements for the Ferguson House and related income.

Summary of Results

No reportable findings and recommendations were noted.


Overall Conclusion


NEBRASKA ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST BOARD GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION OF GRANT AWARDS

NEBRASKA ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST BOARD GRANT AWARDS BY CATEGORY


